8. Why is the angel standing on the land and sea? What does the little book symbolize?
9. What is the significance of the delay? What are some reasons why God may delay answering a prayer?
10. What is the mystery of God? Why does the text say it was finished?
11. Why was John told to eat the little book?

12. What is the significance of measuring the temple of God? What is the standard of measure?
13. In the Scriptures, what is the holy city? Who were the Gentiles that would trample it? What other Scriptures address this same event?
